

Johann Heinrich (John Henry) Beck and his two sons – Johann Wilhelm (John William) and Johann Jacob (John Jacob) are listed on the passenger list of the Lydia in 1740. The Lydia started in Rotterday, Netherlands and landed at Philadelphia on 27 Sep 1740.

In those days, it was typical that only adult males signed the passenger list – so there is no record of any females that were on the ship.
